### Press Statement

The Management of Bank of South Sudan (BoSS) has categorically and unequivocally rejected false and misleading information circulating online alleging that the Governor stated that “rats have damaged 3 trillion South Sudan Pounds in storage facilities.”

The Bank makes it clear that no such statement has ever been made by the Governor or by any authorized representative. The claim is entirely baseless, fabricated, and deliberately misleading, and appears intended to spread misinformation and undermine public confidence in the institution and the financial system.

The Bank strongly condemns the spread of unverified and false information, and urges the public, media houses, and social media users to disregard these unfounded allegations in their entirety. It further advises the public to avoid sharing or amplifying content that distorts facts and contributes to misinformation.

The Bank of South Sudan reiterates that all official communications are issued strictly through its authorized and verified channels. The public is encouraged to rely only on credible sources, including the Bank’s official website ([www.boss.gov.ss](http://www.boss.gov.ss)), its official Facebook page, and other recognized platforms for accurate and timely updates.

The Bank remains committed to transparency, financial stability, and the responsible dissemination of accurate information in public interest.
